From Our President

Where has the first half of 2021 gone? We are already at the close of AAUW FY21, ending June 30th. The ending of one fiscal year and beginning of another is a time of celebration and transitions. Branches hold annual meetings, announce member awards to recognize those who contributed to branch success, hold officer elections, thank departing elected officers while transitioning responsibilities to the successor, and start planning for the new fiscal year.

This is also the time for every member to renew their AAUW membership. I hope you will renew your membership because you continue to support the AAUW mission and believe that the work of your branch and AAUW Pennsylvania exemplifies that mission. While this fiscal year has been marred by COVID uncertainty. anxiety, and burdens, branches met the challenges face on and many thrived. Indeed some lessons learned during this pandemic year will be sustained and adopted as new best practices. And through it all, the AAUW mission and our work to advocate on behalf of women and girls remained constant.

Personally, I am disappointed the ballot initiative to remove the college-degree membership requirement did not receive 66.6% approval to pass. 64.09% of Pennsylvania members voted to approve. In my opinion, this change is not a tactic to increase membership, but something more important. At present, our actions do not match our words as we work on gender equity issues to benefit all women. We will continue the discussion to gain understanding and provide clarity.

At the time of publication, eleven branches are participating in the AAUW Five Star Recognition Program. Meeting the criterion to achieve a star requires dedication to the AAUW mission and demonstration that a branch has embedded those principles into their regular work. We will have a proper celebration after the June 30th program conclusion. In the meantime, please see page 4 to see the achievement to date.

Rewards of Working in Coalition

A few years ago, AAUW-PA joined the Family Care Act Coalition (FCAC) formed to support and promote legislation to establish a paid leave program in Pennsylvania. This was the result of work done by Marianne Bellesorte, our 2017 State Gateway to Equity Award winner, to study the issue of paid leave. The recent AAUW research report, Factory Flaw, offered information on why women leave manufacturing. A major reason was sexual harassment, but researchers also found another reason had to do with parental policies and paid leave. Barbara Price, AAUW-PA Public Policy Chair shared this information and the report with the FCAC. The coalition convener sent a huge thank-you and kudos for sending the AAUW women-in-manufacturing report, which led to a series of very positive developments.

The report was the impetus for FCAC to reconnect with Catalyst Connection, one of Pennsylvania's Industrial Resource Centers supporting small-to-medium manufacturers in southwestern Pennsylvania. That led to their CEO Petra Mitchell becoming a panelist on the FCA roundtable focusing on how paid leave would be a supportive policy for women and the manufacturing sector as a whole and highlighting the report. In addition, the FCAC arranged a press event on Saturday, May 1st featuring Rep. Wendi Thomas, Rep. Dan Miller, and other cosponsors, Rep. Carrie Lewis Delrosso and Sen. Lindsey Williams, at a local manufacturer, JV Manufacturing in Pittsburgh, with a theme of paid leave supporting the manufacturing sector and small businesses. It was great to be able to contribute to a broader understanding of the need for paid leave. We can accomplish so much when we work together.

Virtual Basket Fundraiser at Virtual Summer Retreat

Bidding on baskets will be done through an online, silentauction link located on the AAUW-PA website with the other summer retreat information. Bidding on baskets will open one week before the summer retreat. Bid early; bid often. All proceeds go to the Greatest Needs Fund.

The winner of each basket, the person with the highest bid, will be announced on Saturday afternoon, July 24, during the closing of the retreat. You do not need to be present to win. Payment must be made by PayPal within 48 hours of the close of the summer retreat or the basket will be awarded to the next highest bidder. Then the branch will be notified of the winner so they can ship the basket to them.

We request the value of the basket be in the \$50-100 range. Starting bids will be at \$30, with raises in increments of at least \$2; bids must be in whole dollars only.

THE AAUW 5 PROGRAM



- Governance & Sustainability by ensuring effective leadership succession and strategic plan alignment. AAUW Pennsylvania is participating. Is your branch?



in the Commonwealth to have CTE on campus. And, we know that girls pursuing a CTE path are often the first, one, or only so we wanted to celebrate their accomplishments. The 2021 recipients are the first from Automotive Technology. The Zoom celebration was attended by administration, faculty, parents, and members, and received front page coverage in The Sentinel.



A pure joy gained from volunteering, growing flowers, and a developing interest in painting have helped AAUW State College member Ann Echols find balance in life.

All three activities converged this spring when she was notified that her painting, titled Indian Paintbrush, was selected by AAUW National for its annual art contest. She was among six artists across the country whose work (out of 400 entries) has been recognized in the 12th Annual National AAUW Art Contest. It was featured in a collection of note cards that the organization mailed to members this spring.



Indian Paintbrush measures 3' x 4' and is painted in the impasto style using thick acrylic paint to add dimension and emphasis. Ann has found real benefits from painting as a mental health activity. Art as a therapeutic activity to help all populations deal with stress is a wonderful release. Art is an expression, not an unreachable activity that only a few can do. Ann's love of flowers is found in her large and extremely diverse flower beds, and she shares that love with others through her activities as a Master Gardner. Indian Paintbrush is a natural extension of her garden.

AAUW's Indiana County Branch, in partnership with the Indiana Free Library, is the recipient of a 2021-22 AAUW Community Action Grant of \$10,000 to launch Code Brave: A Coding Club for Girls. The project idea originated with AAUW-IC's Diversity coordinator Lillian Clemons who will also serve as Coding Instructor, and Patricia Holmes, AAUW-IC's Program Vice President. Susan Wheatley is Principal investigator for the branch's grant writing team, assisted by Margaret Stempien. IFL Executive Director Kate Geiger and Lauri Fletcher, program assistant, will accept the award on behalf of the library along with AAUW's Lillian Clemens, coding instructor.

The club will begin as a two-week camp in July, continuing with month-long classes in the fall and next spring. Multi-levels clubs will be planned in a two-week summer camp in June 2022. The funds will provide new laptops for IFL, broadband and software for girls to create computer animations and gaming. The program aims to encourage more girls to pursue STEAM careers in science and arts technology.
