Successful organizations understand the past and plan for the future. The foundation of our work is the AAUW mission, vision, and values:

Mission: To advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education, and advocacy.

Vision: Equity for all.

Values: Non-partisan, fact-based, integrity, inclusion and intersectionality.

AAUW Pennsylvania branch members, national members in Pennsylvania, college and university members, and student associates will work locally to achieve national goals. Together, AAUW Pennsylvania will be a welcoming and inclusive organization that serves as a significant resource and powerful advocate in Pennsylvania to move forward the four areas of the AAUW mission: Education and Training, Economic Security, Leadership, and Governance and Sustainability.

To that end, the Board of AAUW Pennsylvania will:

- Support and mentor branches and members across all demographics.
- Serve as a liaison between national AAUW, Pennsylvania branches, and individual members
- Focus national and state goals for branches, providing ideas and resources to help branches of all sizes work toward those goals.
- Support and advocate for Pennsylvania legislation that empowers women.
- Provide leadership on important issues and help show their relevance at the state and local levels.

In 2020-2022, AAUW Pennsylvania's mission-based activities and projects include work to:

- Advocate for legislation that promotes economic equality for women in the 2020-2022 General Assembly. Promote Work Smart salary negotiation online course across Pennsylvania. (Economic Security)
- Provide financial support for college students to attend NCCWSL.
- Demonstrate support for public education in Pennsylvania.
- Continue to work in coalition with our partners at the state level to address:
 - o Paid leave (The Family Care Act Coalition)
 - Minimum Wage (Raise the Wage PA)
 - Public education and a fair funding formula (PA Schools Work and Education Voters PA)
 - Establishing fair voting districts (Fair Districts)
 - Women's health issues (Campaign for Women's Health).



- Gain an understanding of racial injustice and take affirmative actions to irradicate it from our policies, practices, activities, and events. Recognizing the work is never done, remain attentive and persistent, and encourage branches to do the same.
- Achieve recognition in the AAUW Five Star Recognition program and encourage branches to participate.
- Support the proposal to eliminate the degree requirement for AAUW membership. Seek understanding of opposing opinions, educate members on the reasons for our support, and encourage member involvement.

 - Explore the elements of and obstacles to an inclusive branch.
- Open our virtual events to non-members by publicizing to our state coalition partners and encouraging branches to do the same. (Lee Wolfe)
- Create a "contact us first" behavior with branch leadership. Contact the AAUW Pennsylvania counterpart first instead of calling AAUW national. (All)
 - Communicate often to counterparts to develop a relationship; learn about their issues; provide information.
 - Read everything that comes from AAUW and participate as you can—live or recording. Members are looking to us to know what is going on and being fully informed will help guide our work in the state.
